I am excited to be serving for my first time on the TRBA board! This great organization has been a major part of our rabbit journey since we started 7 years ago. For those who may not know my family, let me introduce us. I raised rabbits in Kentucky as a teenager but sold out when I went to college. When my oldest son turned five, we decided to start back in as a family activity and we have been involved ever since. My two oldest sons both raise their own breeds and actively participate in TRBA and ARBA youth contests. As a family, we raise and show Silvers. We recently attended and participated in the state show and TRBA youth contests. I wish to extend my congratulations to all winners and participants. Texas has some amazing youth! We should all extend a very special thanks to Jennifer Schimpf for running the competitions. She is one of the most organized people I have ever met, and we are blessed in Texas to have her supporting our kids with so much effort and dedication. I am excited to see how our kids do in Reno this fall at the ARBA Convention.

Many who know me are aware that I am an ER veterinarian. I try to keep up to date with relevant rabbit herd medicine. So, for this report, I would like to update TX breeders about our current state with Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus Type 2 (RHDV- 2). For those who may not be aware, RHDV-2 is a virus that is endemic in TX (meaning that it is a permanent fixture in the environment) that affects domestic and wild rabbits and causes sudden and severe liver failure. Many rabbits that become infected will die. The virus is hardy and can persist in the environment for a long time. Due to the virus being endemic, testing is not as common as when the outbreak first started. Texas Parks and Wildlife will still occasionally test and report suspected outbreaks. This spring we have 2 reported cases by TPWD in the wild rabbits. Brown county in Central TX had wild rabbits test positive for RHDV-2 in March. Potter County in the Panhandle had a wild rabbit die off in March and TPWD is reporting that RHDV-2 is suspected but testing was not performed to confirm. Please continue to practice biosecurity in your rabbitries, RHDV-2 is still present in Texas and can be a threat to your herds. Control your fly populations, disinfect items that enter your barn, and report any suspicious die offs to the TX state vet or TPWD.

I would like to draw your attention to the TRBA Youth Rabbit Show Committee Application that is included in this newsletter. This committee is designed to prepare youth members for future leadership roles by providing hands-on experience in the planning and execution of TRBA-sponsored rabbit show. In an attempt to avoid any confusion this Committee is not part of the Scholarship Committee or the Youth Committee that is responsible for educational competitions.

The TRBA Youth Rabbit Show Committee will consist of six youth members and an Adult Advisor. The Youth Committee Positions include Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Show Secretary, Assistant Show Secretary, and 2 Office Staff Positions. Additional youth members may be appointed as needed to support subcommittees and assist during TRBA-sponsored shows. Successful applicants will be at minimum 12 years old and a maximum of 19 years old during the duration of the appointed year. Applicants under the minimum age requirement may be considered for mentorship positions.

The responsibilities of the TRBA Youth Rabbit Show Committee include but are not limited to:

- Assisting with setup and teardown of equipment
- Securing writers
- Securing ramrods when necessary
- Entering placements
- Preparing and organizing folders
- Running folders during shows.

Interested applicants should complete the application and submit it by May 15<sup>th</sup>.

## Add Reflections of the Rabbit Ranch Bus Driver

“Only in the rabbit world.” I say that a lot. Nowhere else do you find this unique blend of family, fun, friendly competition, and people who will give you the shirt off their back, their only precious few free hours on a weekend, or their kind words and encouragement on your hardest days. These are the people my mom can call when we are out of town and a rabbit is loose in the barn (thank you, Don Mersiovsky), and that rally the posse when you lock your keys in your truck at the show (thank you, Susan and David Krauskopf). Together, Loyd and I have been part of this incredible family for forty years, and Loyd himself started nearly fifty years ago as a skinny high school freshman alongside his dad.

When we were asked to share a few thoughts about this year’s state show, I wasn’t sure how to respond. One question that was asked was what does it take to raise a winning rabbit. That’s a big one. It may seem like we’re suddenly having a great run—and we are—but I believe it’s also the result of decades of hard work and dedication finally paying off. Even so, there are plenty of shows where the success just isn’t there. And still, we show up—because these shows feel more like family reunions than competitions.

I’ve long considered myself the “bus driver” on this journey, so I’m not sure I’m the best one to speak on success. After all, I married into this menagerie. I’m the one making sure we have chairs and snacks, and that entries are submitted on time. At home, I feed the rabbits if Loyd is away and check on the “crazy mamas” to be sure all the kits are safe in the box. I bred my first rabbit only about five years ago when Loyd was working out of town during the week. So when it comes to raising a winning rabbit, I can only share what I’ve observed.

If you can’t find Loyd these days, now that he’s retired, he’s either in the barn or in the garden. To someone outside this hobby, it might look like work. But for him, the barn is his happy place. I suspect that success comes from spending countless hours with the rabbits—analyzing, documenting, experimenting, networking, and connecting with others. Loyd would tell you to start with quality stock, breed with purpose, avoid overbreeding or overshadowing, and stay consistent with your feed. And hope that the stars are aligned. I would add this: surround yourself with people who challenge you to be better. In our New Zealand family, that challenge is always present. It began with one of Loyd’s mentors, Guy Leger, and continued with great breeders like Paul and Sue Borden, David Mangione, and Dave Cardinal. Among today’s Texas breeders, you never know who will take top honors—but you can often bet the top four rabbits in a class will represent four different breeders.

Another question we were asked was what does it mean to win at the state show. Oh my goodness—there are hardly words. Last year was truly unprecedented for us with TRBA, both in the spring and fall shows. This year, we were simply grateful to be there and tried to keep our expectations in check. Winning again felt like too much to hope for—and truthfully, we don't want to get voted off the island. This is family, after all.

I've come to appreciate the anticipation during Best in Show judging. I've also learned to move to the end of the table. Being too short to see over the coops doesn't help! Jennifer Schimpf likes to tease me because BIS judging doubles as Breed ID practice for me—I always second-guess myself. Standing back also helps me keep things in perspective.

It's fascinating to watch the judge's process. Do they close the coop after examining a rabbit, or leave it open for a second look? What did that glance mean? And then there's that moment when your rabbit decides it's had enough—fidgeting, refusing to pose—and you just hope it doesn't break a tooth before it's all over.

Best in Show is elusive and special—something hard to define, certainly subjective, and easy to lose by the smallest margin. It's a moment in time, yet one that becomes part of history. It's a celebration, a chance to be grateful, and a reminder that any one of those Best of Breed rabbits could hop into the spotlight.

One of my favorite memories from this year was captured in Sunday's Best in Show. Amy Mersiovsky called us the "Rabbit Queens," since we were all women—and that made it even more special. But what stood out most to me was the diversity within our rabbit family. Judge Lauralee Erbe, assisted by our friend Bart from Thailand, and the top three selections: Jennifer Schimpf's Havana, Roni Nail's English Lop, and our New Zealand. Family, friends—and yes, maybe even a few Rabbit Queens.

You go, girls!

## Official TRBA Sweepstakes Rules

### Eligibility

To qualify for the TRBA Sweepstakes Contests, exhibitor must be an individual member of the TRBA and live in the State of Texas or adjoining states of New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana.

A member will receive a 30-day grace period to renew TRBA membership without sweepstakes penalty. If TRBA membership is not renewed within 30 days, any points previously earned will be forfeited. Points will start over on the new date of membership.

### Contest Calculations

The contest will include all TRBA Sanctioned Shows held from January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup> each year. Only shows held in Texas and sanctioned with TRBA will be counted. Points to be figured on basis of Show Secretary's Report as submitted to the TRBA Sweepstakes Chairperson.

Exhibitors will receive points for the categories that are entered. Youth exhibitors will not be able to transfer their Open shows points to the youth totals. The points will be added based on the category (Open or Youth) entered in that show. Points to be tabulated regularly and the top five (5) of each breed to be published in the TRBA Newsletter.

Points to be counted only as follows based on class placements. There are no points awarded for specials earned (BIS, BOB, BOG, BOV, etc). Points stay within the breed contest. No overall standings contest.

- 1st place receives 6 times the number in class.
- 2nd place receives 4 times the number in class.
- 3rd place receives 3 times the number in class.
- 4th place receives 2 times the number in class.
- 5th place receives 1 time the number in class.

### Awards

Sweepstakes Awards are to be bought by the TRBA by utilizing the 25% show tax funds collected from the hosting clubs. The following minimum requirements must be met to be eligible for a breed sweepstakes award. The Sweepstakes awards will be presented at the Annual State Show Banquet.
